

Blue Zinger Sedge



Carex flacca 'Blue Zinger'

Very easy to grow and great for shady, moist areas where other plants will not grow! Superior to Blue Fescue

- **Use:** Taller and bluer than the straight species, the drifts of steel blue clumps make a spectacular display in the shade. The softly cascading foliage of Carex Blue Zinger will create a pleasing addition to your garden as it bends and sways with the warm summer breezes. A nice edger. Slightly larger, more upright, and more clump-forming than the species, Blue Zinger Sedge adapts to varied soil conditions and is drought tolerant once established. Carex flacca 'Blue Zinger' Blue Zinger Sedge is particularly attractive contrasted with smooth stones or pebbles
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers moist, shady location. Needs ample water in hot dry locations.
- **Growth:** Grows to 8-12" tall and 12-16" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9; Perennial.
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Holds its blue coloring through the winter in milder climates and works well in sweeps as a clumping groundcover. Though evergreen, plan to cut back the foliage in late winter to encourage fresh growth.
- **Flower:** The tiny, yellow flowers emerge in late spring but are not highly ornamental.
