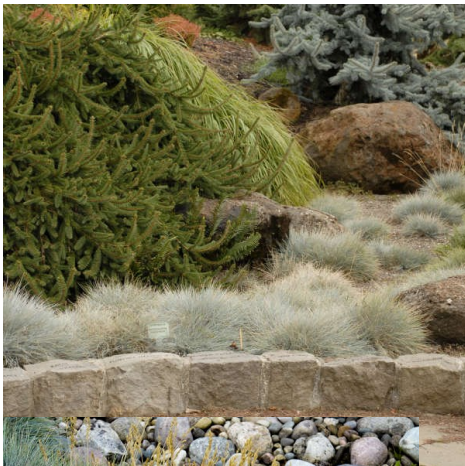


Festina Blue Fescue



Super easy plant grows in sun and dry soils! This hybrid is similar to 'Boulder Blue', but is distinguished by a slightly taller stature, looser habit, and less upright flower stalks.

- **Use:** Soft powdery blue, spiky foliage that keeps its color all year round makes this grass a top pick. One of the more durable and longer-lived varieties, 'Elijah Blue' is a small, clumping grass with a rounded habit. In early summer, wheat-like seed heads are produced on tall, spikey stalks in great numbers. Preferring dryer conditions, this is the perfect grass for rock gardens, in stone troughs or pots, for costal climates, or even for use as edging.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun or at least 5-6 hours of afternoon sun; Water when top 3" of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Grows 8-10" tall and 10-15" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4a-10b; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen; Foliage forms a dome-shaped, porcupine-like tuft of erect to arching, needle-like blades radiating upward and outward to a height of 6-8" (flower stems typically bring total clump height to 14-20").
- **Flower:** Buff colored flowers create eye-catching contrast.
