- **Use:** Same adaptable, tough-as-nails garden performer as the green-leaved type, but in a stunning new yellow-edged variety that is just about the brightest thing to hit the edging-and-groundcover world in years. Just the thing to dot around the shade border, outline a path, or ring the patio garden! Very hardy and adaptable, this tough cookie withstands heat, humidity, drought, poor soil -- well, just about anything.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Almost full sun– shade. Needs just a little shade. Prefers moist, but not wet soils. Tolerates drier conditions when established.
- **Growth:** Forms a neat little rounded tuft about 10 to 12 inches tall and 18 to 24 inches wide.
- **Hardiness:** 6-10, Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. The leaves emerge a fresh, vivid yellow in spring, eventually maturing to deep golden or chartreuse.
- **Flower:** It's topped in late spring with slender, rather underwhelming lavender bloom spikes.
