## Liriope muscari Pee Dee Gold Ingot

- <u>Use:</u> Same adaptable, tough-as-nails garden performer as the greenleafed type, but in a stunning new yellow-edged variety that is just about the brightest thing to hit the edging-and-groundcover world in years. Just the thing to dot around the shade border, outline a path, or ring the patio garden! Very hardy and adaptable, this tough cookie withstands heat, humidity, drought, poor soil -- well, just about anything.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Almost full sun– shade. Needs just a little shade. Prefers moist, but not wet soils. Tolerates drier conditions when established.
- <u>Growth</u>: Forms a neat little rounded tuft about 10 to 12 inches tall and 18 to 24 inches wide.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: 6-10, Perennial
- *Foliage:* Evergreen. The leaves emerge a fresh, vivid yellow in spring, eventually maturing to deep golden or chartreuse.
- *Flower:* It's topped in late spring with slender, rather underwhelming lavender bloom spikes.
