- Use: This stunning native Switchgrass cultivar stands out in the landscape with its striking physical attributes: blue, three-quarter-inchwide leaves and billowy pink-colored, seed heads. It is a native cultivar that makes an excellent substitution for large exotic ornamental grasses such as those in the Miscanthus genus. Switchgrasses are known for being drought tolerant and undemanding about soil. They also provide food and shelter for birds and wildlife.
 - Exposure/Soil: Full sun- part sun. Drought tolerant once established. Needs at least 4 hours afternoon sun. Do not overfertilize or the may become floppy.
- Growth: Medium top fast growing upright clumps 5-6 (in bloom) ft. tall, 4 to 6 ft. wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 4-10, Perennial
- Foliage: Deciduous. Lovely bluish foliage is a complement to Rudbeckia, Echinacea, and other fall blooming daisy flowers. Foliage has winter interest. Cut back to 1' tall in February.
- **Flower:** Fall brings large pastel pink seed heads
