

# Praline Fountain Grass



## *Pennisetum alopecuroides* 'Praline'

- **Use:** Another of the new sterile hybrids from the University of Georgia breeding program. Among the smallest of the sterile hybrids, so it will fit better into smaller gardens. Terrific contrast when used among shrub or backdrop for perennial bed.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun– part sun. Drought tolerant once established. Needs at least 4 hours afternoon sun.
- **Growth:** Dwarf grower 2' tall, 3.5' wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5a-9, Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Slender golden foliage mellows to chartreuse/ yellow late in the season. Cut back grass to 1' tall in February to allow new growth to flush nicely.
- **Flower:** Clumps are adorned with tan plumes throughout the summer months. An infertile variety that flowers spring to fall and will not reseed. Because flowering starts later than most other fountain grass cultivars, the season of interest continues well into the fall. Dried plumes add architectural interest to your winter garden as well.
