

# Wedding Bells Lenten Rose



**Use in winter and holiday combination containers with evergreens or enjoy it in the landscape. A must have for every shade gardener!**

## ***Helleborus 'Wedding Bells'***

- **Use:** Hellebores are the harbingers of spring, blooming for six weeks or more beginning in late winter. They are often flowering during the Christian season of Lent, from which they get their common name, Lenten Rose. This is the perfect plant for naturalizing in moist, woodland areas where its extensive root system will spread as far as it is allowed.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Prefers acidic, (most of our GA soils are acidic) moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy.
- **Growth:** Grows 10-12" tall and 12-14" wide; multiplies well.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen, virtually problem free. Foliage is a handsome silvery-green.
- **Flower:** Double, pure white flowers measure 2-2.5" across. Slightly nodding downwards. One of the heaviest bloomers on the market with 40+ flowers per plant.
