

Double Ellen Purple Lenten Rose



Use in winter and holiday combination containers with evergreens or enjoy it in the landscape. A must have for every shade gardener!

Helleborus orientalis 'Double Ellen Purple'

- **Use:** Hellebores are the harbingers of spring, blooming for six weeks or more beginning in late winter. They are often flowering during the season of Lent, from which they get their common name, Lenten Rose. This is the perfect plant for the shady woodland garden. Their durability makes them perfect for kitchen table bouquets or as charming additions to cut floral arrangements.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Prefers acidic, (most of our GA soils are acidic) moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Do keep on top of pests to prevent disease spread by aphids.
- **Growth:** Grows 10-14" tall and 12-14" wide; multiplies well.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Perennial Reseeding type that can naturalize in your woods.
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Foliage is a handsome green.
- **Flower:** With its double deep-purple maroon blossoms, this variety brings a burst of rich color to the garden.
