

Frost Kiss Bayli's Blush Lenten Rose



A must for color in the winter garden, but still heat tolerant in summer.

Helleborus orientalis 'Frostkiss Bayli's Blush'

- **Use:** As the first plants to bloom in spring, Hellebores demand attention and will earn a special place in your garden, This sister to Helleborus 'Anna's Red' and 'Penny's Pink' is the largest cultivar yet, forming a wide clump of silver-veined, dark green evergreen leaves. The clumps are topped, starting in January-late February, with up to 14 stalks, each ending with a cluster of light pink/lavender flowers.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Good drainage is a must.
- **Growth:** Grows 18 tall and 30" wide. Sterile type.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen, virtually problem free. Older leaves can be cut back in late August to showcase winter blossoms better.
- **Flower:** Has lavender-pink blushed and creamy white flowers that are exceptionally long blooming from mid-January to early April.
