

# Frostkiss Penny's Pink Lenten Rose



**A must for color in the winter garden, but still heat tolerant in summer.**

## *Helleborus x iburgensis* 'Frostkiss Penny's Pink'

- **Use:** Emerging from the last snows of winter, these large, purple-pink flowers speckled in maroon, are a sight to behold. The blossoms are held erect and outward on dark purple stems, the better to admire them in the garden or in vases. Adding season-long interest to the garden is a mound of soft green foliage that emerges after the flowers appear, the leaves elegantly marbled in white.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Good drainage is a must.
- **Growth:** Foliage clumps 24 in. tall and wide. Slowly spreads. Sterile type.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen, virtually problem free. A beautiful selection with fantastic foliage that heralds spring with hot pink veined leaves held on purple petioles. Summer foliage has bright emerald green veining.
- **Flower:** Purple buds open to pink and chartreuse flowers that deepen as they mature. Exceptionally long blooming from February to April.
