Big Time Happy Daylily





Daylilies can survive many harsh conditions that other plants cannot including: polluted city environments, slopes, poor and dry soils, near pavement that is salted in winter, and under Black Walnut trees (not affected by juglone).

Hemerocallis 'Big Time Happy'

- <u>Use:</u> Renowned daylily breeder Darrel Apps, who brought us the popular 'Happy Returns', returns again with an improved version of the classic reblooming daylily. 'Big Time Happy' shares a similar canary yellow flower color to 'Happy Returns', but boasts 4" wide flowers, nearly an inch wider. Slightly ruffled petals open flat to display the rich yellow color, and blooms from early summer to frost.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full— part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of afternoon sun).
 Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year (low in Nitrogen or they will grow more foliage than flowers). Once established needs only occasional water.
- **Growth:** Fast-growing and when in bloom, this mid-size clumper reaches 18 inches tall and 18-24" wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 3-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. The mounding strap like foliage adds a textural element to the garden when not in bloom.
- <u>Flower:</u> Soft petals reveal stylish veins and ruffles that combine with the bright yellow to add a bit of sunny color to any garden or display. They start in midseason and rebloom until fall frost. They have a great fragrance and this new cultivar has flowers that stay open more than 16 hours!
