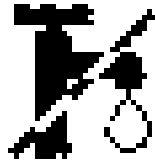


Cosmic Struggle Daylily



Hemerocallis 'Cosmic Struggle'

- Characteristics**
(Compared to Other Daylilies)
- **Midseason Bloomer, blooming in July.**
 - **Rebloomer, producing a second set of flowers.**
 - **Fragrant flowers.**
 - **Semi-Evergreen foliage.**
 - **Tetraploid with 44 chromosomes, twice as many as Diploids. Tetraploids tend to be bigger, stronger plants.**

- **Use:** Daylilies can survive many harsh conditions that other plants cannot including: polluted city environments, slopes, poor and dry soils, near pavement that is salted in winter, and under Black Walnut trees (not affected by juglone). This is considered a premium daylily, which means that it has been selected as highly performing plant with exceptional bloom performance, substantive, vibrantly colored flowers, complete winter/heat hardiness, and a vigorous habit.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of afternoon sun) . Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Once established needs only occasional water.
- **Growth:** Fast-growing and when in bloom, this mid-size clumper reaches 26 inches tall and 18-24” wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. The mounding strap like foliage adds a textural element to the garden when not in bloom.
- **Flower:** Stunningly intense, rich wine purple flowers are lined neatly with a lemon-yellow picotee edge. The purple color holds up well and does not fade. The lined margins accentuate the color for an incredibly attractive look. A subtle, dark lavender watermark above the eye.
