## Daylily 'Grape Ripples'



Can withstand heat and drought, and insects better than most perennials!





## Hemerocallis 'Grape Ripples'

- <u>Use:</u> The daylily is a popular perennial revered for its reliability, ease of growth and beauty. In midsummer, 'Grape Ripples' offers fragrant rich purple flowers with pale green throats. They are day-blooming and arise from robust clumps of green strap-like leaves that are evergreen in southern zones.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full– part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of afternoon sun). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Once established needs only occasional water.
- <u>Growth</u>: Fast-growing and when in bloom, this mid-size clumper reaches 20-24" tall and 18-24"wide. Plants do not usually require dividing for several years, but are easily split apart in fall or early spring.
- Hardiness: Zone 3-10; Perennial
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous. The mounding strap like foliage adds a textural element to the garden when not in bloom. Cut back dead foliage in late fall or winter.
- <u>Flower:</u> Average flower size 5 inches; this daylily will rebloom under favorable conditions; growing season is Midseason; Repeat blooming. Diploid. Remove faded flower stalks for best blooming.
