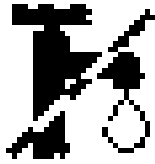


# Lavender Blue Baby Daylily



## *Hemerocallis 'Lavender Blue Baby'*

- Characteristics**  
**(Compared to Other Daylilies)**
- **Early Midseason Bloomer**, blooming in early July.
  - **Rebloomer**, producing a second set of flowers.
  - **Fragrant flowers.**
  - **Dormant foliage.**
  - **Diploid with 22 chromosomes.**  
**Most plants are Diploids.**

- **Use:** Daylilies can survive many harsh conditions that other plants cannot including: polluted city environments, slopes, poor and dry soils, near pavement that is salted in winter, and under Black Walnut trees (not affected by juglone). This is considered a premium daylily, which means that it has been selected as highly performing plant with exceptional bloom performance, substantive, vibrantly colored flowers, complete winter/heat hardiness, and a vigorous habit.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of afternoon sun) . Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Once established needs only occasional water.
- **Growth:** Fast-growing and when in bloom, this mid-size clumper reaches 26 inches tall and 18-24" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. The mounding strap like foliage adds a textural element to the garden when not in bloom.
- **Flower:** A one-of-a-kind beauty! 5", incredibly recurved lavender purple petals have a pronounced lavender blue eye. The two colors complement each other beautifully, and they practically glow in the sun.
