Ruby Stella Daylily



This repeat blooming daylily is a real red hot. beauty!!! This easy to care for plant forms neat, compact clumps.



Hemerocallis 'Ruby Stella'

- <u>Use:</u> Once established, the daylily can be an excellent groundcover on slopes because it has roots that hold soil against erosion. Individual flowers last only one day, but since each plant produces many buds, the total blooming time of a well-established clump may last more than a month. Use this daylily for color in shrub borders and in perennial beds; attracts butterflies.
 - **Exposure/Soil:** Full— part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of afternoon sun). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Do not give too much nitrogen or they will not produce flowers. Once established needs only occasional water.
- **Growth:** It grows 14-18 inches tall and 18-24 wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-11; Perennial
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous. Semi-evergreen grass-like leaves in mild winter areas
- <u>Flower</u>: Showy clusters of deep wine-red lily-like fragrant blooms on tall stems. The flowers appear in late spring to early summer and continue until frost. In its full glory by July! Reblooms freely into early fall if spent flower stalks are promptly removed.
