Hemerocallis 'Stella in Purple'

- <u>Use:</u> This charming version of the ever-popular Stella D'Oro will get as much acclaim as its sibling. With lavender-purple fragrant flowers; it exhibits the same great habit, repeat blooming and it is a cinch to grow and maintain. Hemerocallis Stella in Purple, a diploid, will adapt to a wide range of growing conditions.
 - **Exposure/Soil:** Full– part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of afternoon sun). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Do not give too much nitrogen or they will not produce flowers. Once established needs only occasional water.
- Growth: Fast-growing 20-24" tall and 18-20" wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 3a-9b; Perennial
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous/Evergreen Green, strap-shaped leaves grow in fans. Will retain their foliage in our warmer climate, but should be cut back to maintain a clean look in February.
- <u>Flower:</u> The large fragrant dark purple flowers with a green-yellow center bloom on upright stems in summer and again in fall, attracting butterflies and pollinators.
