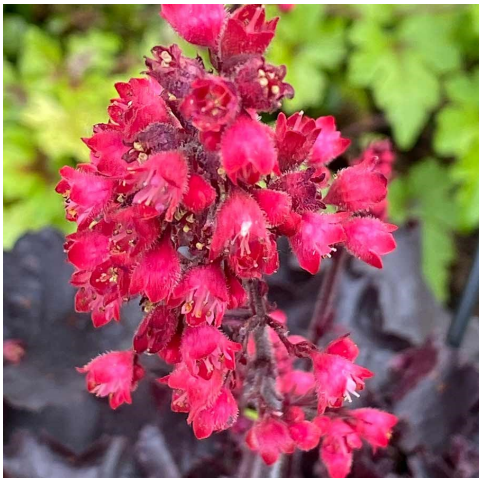


Black Forest Cake Coral Bells

- **Use:** Smooth, dark chocolatey foliage topped with bright cherry-red flowers. What's not to like? Excellent habit and showy flowers are a great addition to any perennial foliage lineup. Medium sized plant that's great in containers and garden beds. Coral bells are easy to grow and blend easily with most other perennials in the landscape. Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets. A real show stopper.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun (morning sun afternoon shade preferred)-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Clumping foliage 6-12 in. tall, 12 in. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Deep black leaves form a compact mound of foliage.
- **Flower:** Beautiful medium-cherry pink flowers are held on dark pink calyxes.
