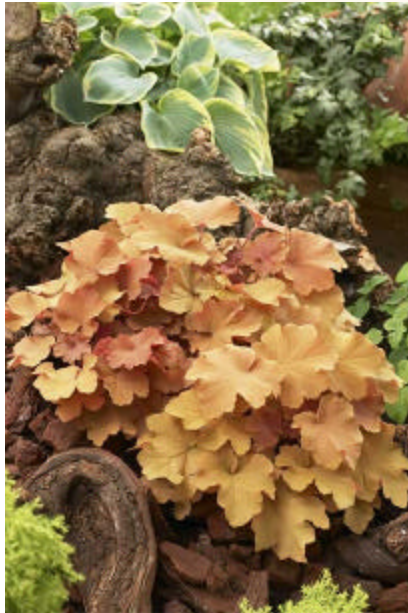


# Caramel Premium Coral Bells



Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets.



## *Heuchera villosa* 'Caramel'

- **Use:** Caramel is very heat- and humidity-tolerant, and its vigorous growth of honey-apricot leaves and clusters of light pink blooms will keep the shade garden colorful from spring through fall.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 12-15 "tall, 20" in bloom overall, by 20" wide.
- **Hardiness:** 5-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. The new leaves unfurl bright gold in spring, covered with a fine down that remains on the leaves as the seasons change. With warmer weather, the leaves take on apricot hues, making the plant glow even more warmly in the shade.
- **Flower:** And in midsummer -- after all other Heucheras in the garden have already bloomed! -- clusters of whitish-pink blossoms arise on slender 18-inch stems. Delightful!
