

Guacamole Coral Bells



Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets.



Heuchera 'Guacamole'

- **Use:** Holy Guacamole! Electric lime-green wavy foliage with a touch of golden highlights energizes your garden. This dazzler provides beautiful contrast to dark-foliaged plants. Sprays of tiny white bells hover above the substantial foliage. Coral Bells offer a dazzling array of foliage color, texture and shapes. Heuchera bearing many dainty flowers make excellent border plants with their neat clumps of ever-green foliage.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 24 "tall, 28" in bloom overall. Plant 28" apart.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Brilliant lime green on extra-large wavy leaves with a matte finish.
- **Flower:** Delightful clusters of whitish-pink blossoms arise on slender 18-inch stems.
