Heuchera 'Indian Summer Huckleberry ('Ifhehb'PBR)' PPAF

- **Use:** Offering a dazzling array of foliage color, texture and shapes, Coral Bells are sure to make a statement in your garden. Heuchera are excellent for the shady or semi-shady border and their bright foliage color can brighten a bed like a flower. Excellent edgers, they also feature dainty flowers held aloft on airy stems. The Indian Summer series is known for its compact leaves and habit, full body shape and unique and visually appealing color selection. This series will perform better under summer's heat than other varieties, but we recommend afternoon shade to prevent late summer leaf scorch.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Morning sun and afternoon shade. Best when planted under other trees (no oak as they are shallow rooted) , but not too deep shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing; foliage reaches 10 to 12 in. tall, 12 to 14 in. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-Evergreen. forming a mound of large, lobed, silvery leaves with dark purple undersides.
- **Flower:** White flowers open from pink buds and hover above the silvery leaves in summer.
