- <u>Use:</u> Coral Bells, are one of the best plants to grow in almost any garden, and their colored leaves come in deep purple leaves to red, pink to salmon color, and greens from dark shades to a lime green. Many of the heuchera are bicolored and some are ruffled. But that's not all! Your heuchera will bloom with multiple long spikes covered with bell-shaped flowers from which it gets its common name: "Coral Bells" although some of the newer cultivars have creamy white flowers which show up better against the colorful folaige.
 - <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- <u>Growth</u>: Moderate growing; foliage reaches 12 to 18in. tall, 12 to 14 in. wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 5-9; Perennial
- Foliage: Semi-evergreen. Gorgeous ruffled red foliage.
- <u>Flower:</u> Small, creamy white-pink flowers borne in open, airy panicles appear in late spring to early summer on slender, wiry stems rising above the foliage mound, typically to 12-18" tall.
