## Indian Summer Orangeberry Coral Bells





Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets.



## Heuchera 'Indian Summer Orangeberry' ('Ifheorr')

- <u>Use:</u> Fantastic color towards the front of the border or in pots year round. It is a great ornamental plant for the shade. Delightful! We love to use them in containers in fall with mums and grasses, but they are just as showstopping in spring and summer.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- <u>Growth</u>: Fast growth to 12-15 "tall, 20" in bloom overall, by 20" wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 5-8; Perennial
- <u>Foliage</u>: Semi-evergreen. Beautiful brunt-orange foliage with lots of ruffling along the edges.
- *Flower:* Dark red stems produce lovely sprays of small creamywhite bell-shaped flowers above neat mounds of foliage over a long season.
