

# Indian Summer Orangeberry Coral Bells



Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets.



## *Heuchera 'Indian Summer Orangeberry' ('Ifheorr')*

- **Use:** Fantastic color towards the front of the border or in pots year round. It is a great ornamental plant for the shade. Delightful! We love to use them in containers in fall with mums and grasses, but they are just as showstopping in spring and summer.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 12-15 "tall, 20" in bloom overall, by 20" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Beautiful burnt-orange foliage with lots of ruffling along the edges.
- **Flower:** Dark red stems produce lovely sprays of small creamy-white bell-shaped flowers above neat mounds of foliage over a long season.
