

Peach Flambe Heuchera



Heuchera x 'Peach Flambe'



Striking when massed in a woodland border or tucked into a rock garden, even lovely with frost in winter.

- **Use:** A clump-forming coral bells hybrid that features lobed and rounded bright peach leaves infused with red. Leaves acquire plum tones in fall. Foliage typically forms a compact basal mound to 7" tall and to 14" wide. Small, bell-shaped, creamy white flowers borne in open, airy panicles appear in late spring to early summer on slender, wiry stems rising above the foliage mound to 16" tall. The color progression of 'Peach Flambe' thru the year provides multi-seasonal interest as a superb color companion with spring yellows, summer blues, and fall oranges.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 7 "tall, 16" in bloom overall, by 12-14" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Bright peach-colored leaves that literally glow in spring, summer and fall, turning to plum in winter. Large, smooth leaves and flaming red infusions create drama in the garden.
- **Flower:** White flowers hover above the blazing leaves.
