

# Big Top Caramel Apple Coral Bells



**Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets.**



## ***Heuchera villosa* 'Big Top Caramel Apple'**

- **Use:** It's electrifying! Jagged bolts of dark red veining permeate the large golden/chartreuse leaves with flashes of vivid color. A villosa type, it delivers steadfast color with excellent heat and humidity tolerance. Billowing white flowers in summer float above on tall scapes. New leaves emerge red-burgundy and mature to a caramel color. Significantly larger than the Carnival series. Plants size up nicely in the landscape.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Will tolerate full sun with sufficient water. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 16-18 "tall, 20" in bloom overall, by 16" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. New leaves emerge red-burgundy and mature to a caramel color. Larger than the Carnival series. Plants size up nicely in the landscape. Foliage is rabbit resistant.
- **Flower:** And in midsummer -- after all other Heucheras in the garden have already bloomed! -- clusters of creamy blossoms arise on slender 20-inch stems. Delightful!
