Forbidden Fruit



Shade loving and very easy to grow! Shady garden spaces can become hum-drum and boring without the addition of a new perennial plant from time to time.

Hosta 'Forbidden Fruit'

- <u>Use:</u> Great for shady areas such as under trees or for areas with morning sun only. It is an improvement of 'Orange Marmalade'. It is listed as a tetraploid cultivars. Forbidden Fruit is quite slug resistant, making it a great choice for display gardens and out of the way shade beds.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun (best)—shade. Acid, moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year.
- **Growth:** The mounded foliage reaches 18" tall and 30" wide and produces 30" arching scapes.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 5-8 Perennial
- Foliage: Deciduous. Center of the leave is orange-yellow, a blue -green to green-blue margin. Later, in the middle of summer center turns to yellow-white, but not as much as by 'Orange Marmalade'. Slug resistant.
- <u>Flower</u>: In the summer, this rich mound of foliage is topped and accented with spikes of large, lavender flowers.
