

## Hosta 'Mini Skirt' PP26743

- <u>Use:</u> This petite and flirty hosta forms a miniature mound of very wavy, thick, blue-green leaves with creamy yellow margins in spring. In summer, the center turns more green and the edge lightens to creamy white. Pale lavender flowers with deeper purple stripes appear closely packed together on short, very proportionately sized scapes in early to midsummer.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Part sun (morning sun and afternoon shade is best)—shade. Acid, moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year.
- *Growth:* The 5-7" tall and 13" wide clumps.
- Hardiness: Zone 3-9; Perennial
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Miniature mound of thick, wavy leaves. Blue-green leaves have creamy yellow margins.
- **Flower:** Pale lavender flowers contrast beautifully with the yellow foliage in mid to late summer.
