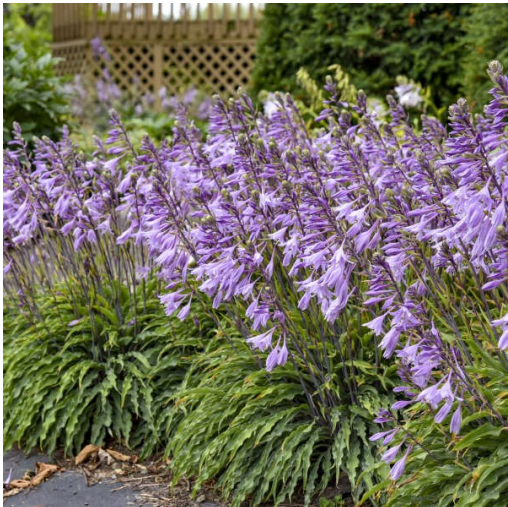


Silly String Hosta



Hostas are exceedingly popular perennials in today's gardens due to their versatility in the landscape. Their subtle colors, tall flower scapes, and broad, coarse leaves fill a niche in garden designs that few other plants can achieve. Their large leaves provide excellent coverage for dying bulb foliage. Hostas also grow well in city environments where the air may be polluted by car exhaust, etc.

Hosta 'Silly String' PP32127

- **Use:** This is definitely a hosta that you can identify without a plant tag! This unique hosta has narrow blue leaves with intensely wavy margins. The leaves are the most blue in spring; as the season progresses the leaves become more blue-green. Pale purple flowers top the plant for a perfect package. Perfect for containers or the front of the shade garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun (best)–shade. Acid, moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year.
- **Growth:** The 14" tall and 28" wide clumps.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9, Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Incredibly long, narrow leaves with lots of ruffles. The plant starts out blue in the spring and turns more blue-green by mid summer.
- **Flower:** This heavy bloomer produces purple flowers in early summer reaching heights of 17-27 inches tall.
