

Clyde Redmond Louisiana Iris



Sun loving, easy to grow, deer resistant, and can withstand up to 4" of water in a pond or drainage ditch!



Iris louisiana 'Clyde Redmond' (Puttytat x Snow Pearl)

- **Use:** Registered as a cornflower blue self with a yellow signal. This is a relatively short and remarkably vigorous blue. The deep color and garden performance has made it very popular over the years. Enjoy deep wedgewood blue flowers with this Louisiana Iris. The flowers are exceptionally beautiful and add color to the water garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial shade, in fertile well drained soil. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Tolerates up to 4" of water. In times of drought supplement water. Place in a pond no deeper than 1/3 maximum recommended planting depth to allow the plants to establish.
- **Growth:** Grows 24" tall. Divide every 3-4 years. Space new container grown plants 18" - 36" apart.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-11; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Foliage usually dies back in winter, ut may stay evergreen. Cut back in early spring.
- **Flower:** Lovely blue water iris with gold signals. Fades to a more delicate shade. A prolific bloomer and in some areas will re-bloom later in the season.
