- <u>Use:</u> The amethyst purple flowers of this reblooming iris burst into bloom every spring, heralding the return of color to the garden! The large, billowy, ruffled blooms are sweetly fragrant and attractive to butterflies. Why wouldn't you want this regal beauty in the garden border? Pair with the dramatic yellow and purple bearded irises for a spectacular show.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial shade, in fertile well drained soil. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year.
- **Growth:** Grows 32-38" tall. Divide every 3-4 years. Space new container grown plants 18" 36" apart.
- Hardiness: Zone 4-9; Perennial
- Foliage: Deciduous. Graceful, thick, long blades.
- **Flower:** Purple flowers infused reddish violet, lighter area around blue beard; ruffled; with a sweet fragrance. Reliable late summer and fall rebloomer
