

Pegaletta Louisiana Iris



Iris louisiana 'Pegaletta'

- **Use:** This beautiful iris pond plant has a beautiful color combination that is simply striking. A lovely addition to your flower bed or water garden. Attractive, green, sword-like foliage. Louisiana Iris blooms in early to late spring, depending on zone, and are an exciting pond plant for your rain garden, bog, pond or terrestrial garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial shade, in fertile well drained soil. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Tolerates up to 4" of water. In times of drought supplement water. Place in a pond no deeper than 1/3 maximum recommended planting depth to allow the plants to establish.
- **Growth:** Grows 32-36" tall. Divide every 3-4 years. Space new container grown plants 18" - 36" apart.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-11; Perennial
Marsh irises end their vegetative cycle in summer, turning more yellow, but regain vigor in autumn, remaining green throughout the winter until spring
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Graceful, narrow sword-shaped, green foliage.
- **Flower:** Large purple flowers and a yellow signal.
