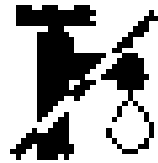


Peacock Black Joker Siberian Iris



Iris sibirica 'Peacock Black Joker'

- **Use:** Striking blooms with an exotic combination of colors rise above refined, slender, sword-like foliage. Three distinct colors of petals combine deep purple, light lavender, and electric blue. Use in mass plantings for a stunning effect.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial shade, in fertile well drained soil. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Their thick roots drive down deeply, which makes them drought resistant (though they also thrive in damp soil) and great plants for holding steep banks in place. Each clump becomes huge, and when a group of them grows together, weeds can't grow in between.
- **Growth:** Grows 2-3' tall and wide. Divide every 3-4 years. Space new container grown plants 18" - 24" apart.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Narrow, lance-shaped leaves. After bloom, the grassy leaves stand erect and green through the growing season.
- **Flower:** Beautiful, dark, burgundy blue flower. The lower petals - falls - are in burgundy purple, the upper petals - standards - are bright azure blue. Beautiful in bouquets, blooms on long stems.
