

# Caesar's Brother Iris



## *Iris sibirica* 'Caesar's Brother'

- **Use:** A very rich Pansy violet that appears nearly black. 'Caesar's Brother' is an old, award-winning variety and remains in great demand because few others can rival its deep coloring and exceptional vigor. A mature clump in its glory is simply breathtaking. Deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial shade, in fertile well drained soil. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Their thick roots drive down deeply, which makes them drought resistant (though they also thrive in damp soil) and great plants for holding steep banks in place. Each clump becomes huge, and when a group of them grows together, weeds can't grow in between.
- **Growth:** Grows 36" tall. Divide every 3-4 years. Space new container grown plants 18" - 24" apart.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8 Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Narrow, lance-shaped leaves. After bloom, the grassy leaves stand erect and green through the growing season.
- **Flower:** Beardless dark blooms in summer above graceful foliage. More delicately flowered than Bearded Iris, the Siberian have medium-sized flowers on 3 1/2 foot stalks.
