

Mozelle Lantana



Heat tolerant, drought tolerant, deer resistant, little to no need for deadheading, versatile, fragrant, attractive to butterflies and hummingbirds, what is there not to love?



Lantana camara 'Mozelle'

- **Use:** "Tough as nails" best describes perennial Lantana, blooming continuously from spring until fall frost. Mozelle has bright pink and yellow bi-color flowers and a smaller size than Miss Huff. It attracts butterflies and hummingbirds like magnets, while the pungent foliage repels deer. Drought tolerance is another outstanding feature. Similar to 'Miss Huff' in size and hardiness, but the flowers are much softer in color, varying from pale yellow to peach and soft pink. Sterile.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full sun– part sun. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows 2-3' tall and 24-30" wide. Prune occasionally to keep in the topiary form.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 9-11, Annual/ Tender Perennial if lucky. Mulch well in the winter. Do not cut back stems until following April after winter is passed.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Scented leaves. Cutting grown.
- **Flower:** Produces masses of multi-colored pink and yellow blooms from summer to fall.
