
Purple Trailing Lantana









Heat and sun tolerant; flowers all season; low maintenance.

Lantana montevidensis

- <u>Use:</u> Tropical appearing shrub, but hardy! Plant characteristics are similar to other Lantanas. Fine for mass plantings and banks, or containers for poolside...attracts butterflies. Trailing Lantana's foliage will change to a red to purple color in the colder months.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full sun– part sun. Drought tolerant once established. Needs at least 6 hours afternoon sun.
- **<u>Growth</u>**: Trailing form of Lantana and will only get 12-15" in height with a 3-6 foot spread, making it a nice groundcover.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: 7b-11, Tender perennial. <u>Do not cut back stems until</u>
 <u>April of following spring.</u> Be patient as they might not sprout until
 May! Water in the hollow stems will freeze out the roots in winter.
 Mulch heavily around the plant
- **Foliage:** Scented leaves. Deciduous. Cutting grown.
- <u>Flower</u>: The blooms are lilac pink to purple with yellow centers, appear in masses from spring to fall, and are great for attracting but-terflies.
