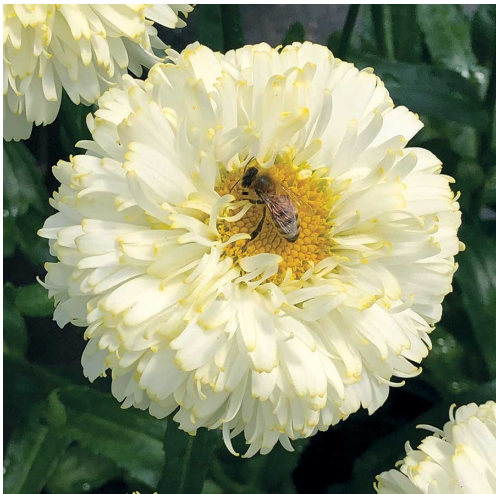
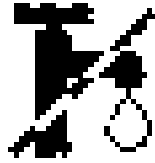


Luna Shasta Daisy



Shastas mix so effortlessly with other perennials like salvias and grasses that no garden should be without them!

- **Use:** Shasta Daisies are all-time favorites for the perennial border. The cheery flowers begin to appear in early summer and continue on for several months if faithfully deadheaded. Shastas mix so effortlessly with other perennials that no garden should be without them! Use in mixed beds and mass plantings.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial sun. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results. Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Fast growing to 19-22" tall in bloom. Spreads to 20-22" in width.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9 Perennial. Very heat tolerant! Mulch around plant in the winter.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green foliage.
- **Flower:** Proves the moon is out! Showy, pom-poms of double flowers rest atop a dense, upright, mound of foliage. Flowers bloom yellow, then gradually change to a two-toned yellow and finally finish white. Flowers stay yellow for two weeks or longer, unlike other "yellows" that fade in a matter of days.
