

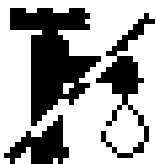
Heavenly Blue Lithodora



With such a long flowering period, Lithodora 'Heavenly Blue' gives a superb performance as ground cover in rockeries, troughs or at the edge of borders.

Lithodora diffusa 'Heavenly Blue'

- **Use:** This is an old rock garden favorite with deep cobalt-blue flowers, justly popular for nearly a century. Mounding stems with small, evergreen foliage form low, spreading hummocks that bloom late spring and early summer, in full sun and well-drained soil.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full sun with a little shade during the hot afternoon sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry to start. Take care to keep soil moist. Water under the leaves. Plants **MUST** have a well-drained, acidic soil in order to thrive. Heavy clay soils are sure death.
- **Growth:** Moderate-growing to 4-6" high, 1' wide. Prune lightly in late summer by trimming the new tip shoots back by about half, to encourage a dense habit. Plants are shrubby, so hard pruning is not recommended.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 6-9, Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Leaves are narrow, up to an inch long.
- **Flower:** Deep blue, funnel-shaped flowers renew themselves all summer long. .
