

Night Light Moneywort



Unusual dark bronze leaves have bright lime veining. Vivid yellow flowers make for great pops of color against the dark foliage. While versatile enough for part sun or shade we recommend planting in more shade where the foliage will develop its darker look. Plant with Charteuse Acorus, Carex, Heuchera, or Sedum Ogon.

Lysimachia alfredii 'Night Light' PP33931

- **Use:** This flowering groundcover provides a colorful mound of attractive foliage and bright yellow flowers. 'Night Light' brightens up shade gardens and offers continuous flowering from Spring until hard frost in Fall. Excellent for covering large areas in part shade quickly. Use in hanging baskets, containers and window boxes. Deer resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full sun(would need a fair amount of regular watering) to shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Drought tolerant when established, but prefers moist soil.
- **Growth:** The non-invasive stems spread out to 10-12" high and 10-14" wide each season.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5a-9a; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. dark green leaves that bear a purple cast and silvery green veining. The stems and the undersides of the leaves are maroon. Stems should be trimmed to six inches in late fall.
- **Flower:** Covered with yellow blooms all summer long! Self-cleaning, no deadheading necessary. Attracts butterflies, hummingbirds and pollinator bees.
