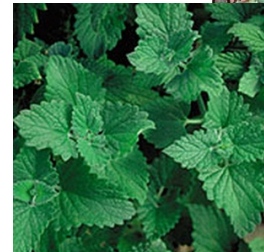


Reblooming Catmint



Nepeta faassenii 'Felix'

- **Use:** Compared to other Catmints the color is better, the habit far more compact and less spreading, the foliage is highly aromatic, and the bloom continues all summer if you shear the plant back after the first flowers pass! But even when it's not blooming, Felix is a delight. It would make a fine edging, sunny border plant, or container specimen as well as an herb garden standout! Catmint is not only beautiful but useful in the garden. If you have a vegetable garden, plant Felix heavily among your Peppers, Tomatoes, and Potatoes -- it has been demonstrated to keep aphids, potato beetles, squash bugs, and asparagus beetles away. Felix Very tolerant of heat and drought, it's ideal for any sunny garden spot.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial sun, in well drained soil. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year.
- **Growth:** Reaches about a foot high and spreads 18 to 24 inches wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8 Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. The gray-green foliage is strongly scented, so be sure to plant it where you can brush against it.
- **Flower:** You will love these intensely blue blooms, arising on spikes 3 to 4 inches long. Felix is a very well-branched little plant, so you can expect PLENTY of blooms!
