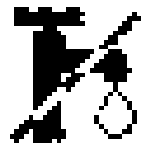


Oenothera speciosa 'Siskiyou'

- **Use:** *Oenothera speciosa* is native to much of the United States. It is naturally found in rocky prairies and plains, but is also commonly seen in fields, waste areas, roadsides and other disturbed areas. The flowers are large, clear pink and produced throughout summer in large quantities. Attracts humming birds and is deer resistant! Juglone tolerant (a chemical given off by certain nut trees.)
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full-part sun. Fairly drought tolerant and needs little water once established, but prefers good drainage. Prefers poor soil and little fertilizer or it will become floppy.
- **Growth:** Grows 12-18" high and 24-36" wide. A rapidly spreading perennial plant that makes a deciduous ground cover, but it should be contained as it is very aggressive. Plants spread both by rhizomes and by seed.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-9 Perennial.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Striking dark variegated foliage. The long slender lance shaped leaves are green with jagged maroon variegation running along their center.
- **Flower:** 2" pink, cup-shaped flowers most of the early summer are open during the day. Cut back the growth where it becomes disordered.
