

# Sundrops



## *Oenothera tetragona* 'Missourensis'

- **Use:** Sundrops is a cheerful perennial forming clumps one to two feet tall and blooming in early summer. The rich dark green leaves turn bronze for the winter. Grow Sundrops in a dry or average well-drained site in sun or light shade. Place it in the front of the garden with other drought-tolerant species or naturalize it on a sunny bank.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full-part sun. Fairly drought tolerant and needs little water once established, but prefers good drainage.
- **Growth:** Grows 16" high and 20" wide. Will reseed so be sure to give it room!
- **Hardiness:** 5-9 perennial.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. The rich dark green leaves turn bronze for the winter.
- **Flower:** Two inch bright yellow 4-petaled flowers clustered at the ends of stems are open during the day unlike those of the related Evening Primrose. Cut back the growth where it becomes disordered.
