- <u>Use:</u> If you're decorating for a St. Patrick's Day party, you'll want to include a festive potted shamrock plant or several shamrock houseplants.
 But party or not, shamrocks are an attractive indoor plant. Keep away from pets.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Place the plant in an area that is room temperature and receives good air circulation and bright, but not direct, light. Soil should be kept lightly moist. Water sparingly and allow the soil to dry out between waterings. Fertilize with a balanced houseplant food every few months.
- **Growth:** Grows 6-8" wide and high. It can become weedy so we recommend you keep them in pots.
- Hardiness: Zone 8-11; Perennial. Also can be a houseplant.
- **Foliage**: Deciduous. The handsome 3-lobed foliage is green with large, shamrock-shaped leaves. Most species of shamrock, which grow from tiny bulbs, lose their leaves and go dormant a few times a year. The dormancy period, which may range from a few weeks to a few months, is part of the normal growing cycle. During dormancy, stop watering, and place the plant in a cool, dark place. When you see new growth, move your shamrock back into bright light and resume watering
- **Flower:** The clumps are topped in fall with white flowers.
