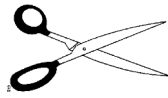


Amalia Olson Peony



Paeonia 'Amalia Olson'

- **Use:** This pure white full double flower of medium height, with dark green foliage. It was awarded the American Home Achievement Medal Peonies are classic garden plants that add a bit of nostalgia and charm to the garden. Their fragrant blooms and lush foliage have made them popular for years, and with the recent resurgence in breeding, they will continue to improve. Peonies are simple to grow and can be utilized in many ways, including mass plantings, specimens, or hedges. **WE LOVE PEONIES, BUT THEY ARE NOT A BEGINNER PLANT! LOTS OF RESEARCH NEEDED AND SOIL PREP FOR SUCCESS!**
- **Exposure/Soil:** Morning sun and a little afternoon shade preferred (not deep shade); Water regularly, when top 3" of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer twice a year in spring and fall. Once established needs only occasional water. In very hot summers it may go summer dormant. SOIL is very important and must be well drained and have a pH of 6.5-7 so Georgia clay will need to be amended with Lime.
- **Growth:** Grows 3 feet tall and 2' 6" wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Dark green lobed leaves.
- **Flowers:** Its white petals overlap and are symmetrically arranged in a slightly dome shaped flower of great beauty and charm. It has excellent substance and lasts well when cut. It often has faint red markings on the reverse of its guard petals which never show inside, making it one of the purest white peonies available.
- **Tips:** *Plant them shallow, mulch in the summer, take off the mulch in the winter, and they prefer a little afternoon shade. Cold winters will ensure lots of blossoms so plant them where they will get cold in the winter and cool in the summer too.*

Pure white dome-shaped, fragrant flower with strong stems. Stands up well in wet weather.

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
