

# Rock Rose



Small five-petal flowers are no more than one inch across, appearing in the early summer and lasting till fall.



## *Pavonia lasiopetala*

- **Use:** Native shrub-like perennial displays eye-catching hibiscus-like pink to rose colored flowers from summer to fall. Carefree and versatile; performs in enriched garden soils with regular irrigation to very dry, rocky, unimproved soils and drought. Deer resistant. Semi-evergreen.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Drought resistant Texas native that is exceptionally free flowering and adaptable to a wide range of growing conditions provided it has a well drained soil and 4 or more hours a day of sunlight.
- **Growth:** Quickly reaches 3 to 4 ft. tall, 3 ft. wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 8-9; Tender Perennial. Mulch during winter to protect roots from frost and prune in early spring for bushier growth. Will sell sow from seeds too.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Bearing light green, velvety, heart-shaped leaves
- **Flower:** deep rose pink miniature hibiscus-like flowers which open in the morning and close up by early afternoon in our highest heat.
