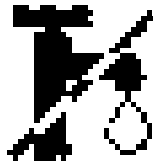


# Blue Buttons Woodland Phlox



**Native to Eastern US  
Excellent for shade  
Gardens and one of  
the first blooms of  
spring in our garden.**



## ***Phlox divaricata ssp laphamii 'Blue Buttons'***

- **Use:** Lavender-blue, fragrant blooms over low mounds of very narrow dark green foliage in late spring. Also known as Wild Sweet William or Woodland Phlox, It can form large drifts as its leafy shoots root at the nodes as they spread along the ground.
- **Exposure/Soil:** prefers partial to full shade and humus-rich, well-drained soil. It is drought tolerant, but maintain consistent soil moisture for best appearance. Cut back hard after flowering if foliage looks bad.
- **Growth:** Grows 12-15 tall and wide. Plants will spread and can form large colonies over time.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-9; It will also self sow.
- **Foliage:** Semi evergreen; Foliage is lance shaped and medium green.
- **Flowers:** Fragrant soft blue blooms on compact plants.
