

# Chattahooche Woodland Phlox



## *Phlox divaricata* 'Chattahooche'

- **Use:** Prized for its fantastic spring flowers, this unique Phlox is a low growing, semi-evergreen type that flowers profusely in late spring. Fragrant, soft lavender blue flowers with a bright purple eye are produced in loose clusters above the bright green, glossy foliage.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Partial shade is best. Prefers moist, well drained soil, but is fairly drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Grows 12" tall and wide. Plants will spread and can form large colonies over time.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8; Will need protection from cold winds in our area.
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Lance-shaped to elliptic, shiny, dark green leaves (to 2" long).
- **Flowers:** Loose clusters of slightly fragrant, tubular, pale lavender-blue flowers with maroon throats and five, flat, petal-like lobes appear at the stem tips in spring. A prolific bloomer.
