- **Use:** Phlox paniculata, known affectionately as garden phlox, is a lovely native plant ranging from New York to Iowa and all the way down to Georgia, Mississippi, and Arkansas. This cheerful flower has found a way to thrive beyond its original garden homes and has become a delightful addition to many other areas. Full, deep-green foliage and strong stems support the large flower heads.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Prefers full sun to part sun. Water when top 3" of soil is dry. Does not like sprinklers, water soil not leaves.
- **Growth:** Fast growth of 2-3' tall and 2' wide.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3a-9b; Perennial.
- **Foliage:** Deciduous; Light green mildew resistant foliage.
- **Flower:** Starting in early summer and continuing long after other phlox selections have faded, with flower heads of light pink flowers, each with a darker pink eye...beloved by hummingbirds.
