

McDaniel's Cushion Creeping Phlox



Phlox subulata 'McDaniel's Cushion'

- **Use:** An RHS award-winning fragrant edger, it is also lovely when allowed to drape over a low stone wall or cascade down a slope. Deer resistant. Attracts butterflies, hummingbirds and pollinator bees to the garden. Drought and salt tolerant once established. Plant a carpet of color! Beautiful masses of flowers topping creeping stems make an attractive ground cover or accent in a rock garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun– part sun, very easy to please. Provide well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer. Superb in borders, beds, and open woodland gardens.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower to 3-6 in. tall, 1-1.5 ft. wide
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-9, Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Small trailing leaves.
- **Flower:** Pour on the brilliant rose-pink color in late winter –early summer with a shower of flowers. We find that a very light shearing of flowers after they finish blooming can help with even more re-blooming and creates fuller plants.

DROUGHT TOLERANT! Carpets hillside in blossoms. Good for erosion control on embankments.
