

Hot Pink Spring Creeping Phlox/ Thrift



Phlox subulata 'Spring Hot Pink'

- **Use:** Brilliant starry hot pink flowers cover the evergreen foliage in late spring. Carefree for the novice or expert gardener. Plant on a slope or bank for a rewarding flash of color. The blanket of color in late spring will turn heads of passersby. Phlox Spring™ Hot Pink forms lush mounds about 4-6" thick. With its uniform, dense flowering, every square inch of foliage will be covered in flowers.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Sun– part sun, very easy to please. Provide well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer. Good soil drainage is important. Cut back stems after flowering by 1/2 to maintain form and promote denser growth plus to stimulate a possible light rebloom.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower to 4-6 in. tall, 3 ft. wide
- **Hardiness:** Zone 3-8, perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Small trailing leaves.
- **Flower:** Has brilliant, hot pink flowers on uniform plants.



DROUGHT TOLERANT! Carpets hillside in blossoms. Good for erosion control. Superb in borders, beds, and open woodland gardens.
