DROUGHT TOLERANT! Carpets hillside in blossoms. Good for erosion control. Superb in borders, beds, and open woodland gardens.

Phlox subulata 'Spring Series'

- <u>Use:</u> Brilliant starry flowers cover the evergreen foliage in late spring. Carefree for the novice or expert gardener. Plant on a slope or bank for a rewarding flash of color. The blanket of color in late spring will turn heads of passersby when used on hillsides, over walls, or even used in a natural lawn. With its uniform, dense flowering, every square inch of foliage will be covered in flowers. This is a selection of a native North American species.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Sun– part sun, very easy to please. Provide welldrained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer. Good soil drainage is important. Cut back stems after flowering by 1/2 to maintain form and promote denser growth plus to stimulate a possible light rebloom.
- <u>Growth</u>: Moderate grower to 4-6 in. tall, 3 ft. wide. Prune lightly after flowering to encourage a tidy habit and sometimes a rebloom.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 3-8, Perennial
- **Foliage:** Evergreen. Small trailing, green leaves.
- **<u>Flower</u>**: This series has numerous colors with real "WOW" power and one of the earliest of spring bloomers.
